Why not stop in at The Store @ Tai Tapu for a high tea or coffee? They offer a unique blend of on-site food using local produce and have gluten free and vegan options. Take the kids and relax while they play in the sand pit, plus pop into the gift shop for that special gift or treat for yourself.

Close by you can see the charming St Paul's Church and the old Tai Tapu Library – both completed in 1932. Or head to the Tai Tapu Domain playground, sports courts or golf course.

A place not to miss is the factory shop at **Sovereign Salmon** in **Hororata**. The team manufacture hot and cold smoked salmon, plus a range of local produce is also on offer including award-winning cheeses, fruit pastes and terrines.

For the berry lovers head to one of the local blueberry or gooseberry orchards and pick your own.

Berries Direct are also open for blueberries and gooseberries and strive to produce a delicious berry while looking after the environment and soils.

Head to their farm shop for fresh or frozen berries, or head into the orchards and pick your own.

Whether you're in Selwyn for the hiking, biking or travelling on the road, refresh and revive at **Porters Lodge.** Their all-day menu has a variety of dishes sure to satisfy. Chill out on the sun deck with a local craft beer, a glass of wine or a coffee.

Explore the legendary **Castle Hill rocks**, disappear into the peaceful hiking trails, take in the stunning alpine vista, catch trophy trout or hurtle down one of the mountain bike trails on the **Craigieburn Range**, it's all on your doorstep. Adrenaline junkies will love the 2.3km, purpose-built mountain bike flow trails, starting and finishing right at the Porters Lodge.
